BUDAPEST, HUNGARY—A Butterfly line array was recently sold to Arton by Zaj Discotechnika, Outline's longtime exclusive Hungarian distributor. The system, which recently debuted in the stylish setting of the Budapest Opera House, comprises 16 Butterfly CDH 483 Hi-packs and eight Victor Live subwoofers, all powered and controlled by T Series digital amplifiers and Genius 24 processors.

We measured a difference of just 4 dB between the front row and the seats farthest from the stage, but the subjective difference was even less."
